### **Pathways General Education Requirements**

Students are responsible for completing the Pathways General Education requirements that are in effect when they enter the university. The university requires students to complete course work from all seven areas of the Curriculum for Pathways General Education.

#### GPA Requirements

Students must maintain a 2.0 GPA. In-major GPA requires a grade of C- or better to successfully complete an ART course. In-major GPA is calculated on all ART courses.

### Satisfactory Progress Toward Degree (Policy 91)

The University requires every department to establish benchmarks by which their majors can demonstrate that they are making satisfactory progress toward a degree. In addition to the University requirement for satisfactory progress (See Satisfactory Progress in Academics chapter of Undergraduate Catalogue), in the case of the Graphic Design major, these benchmarks are:



- 1. Students must earn a C- or better in required Foundations courses (1204, 1404, 1604, 1214).
- 2. Upon having attempted 72 semester hours (including transfer, AP, advanced standing and credit by exam) a student must have completed at least 6 credits towards this major with a 2.0 overall GPA and have a minimum 2.0 in-major GPA.
- 3. Students must successfully complete their BFA exhibition (ART 4894).

#### Prerequisites

#### Foreign Language Requirement

Students who do not successfully complete at least two units of a single foreign language, classical language or American Sign Language during high school must successfully complete six semester hours of a single college level foreign language or classical language at the college level.
