Minimum overall and in-major GPA 2.0. In-major GPA includes 6 hours in ECON 2005-2006, 42 hours in PUA core (UAP 1024, UAP 3014, UAP 3024, UAP 3224, UAP 3344, UAP 4184, UAP 4714, UAP 4754, UAP 4914, PSCI 1014, PSCI 2054, SPIA 1004, STAT 2004 or 3604), and 15 hours in PUA concentration. Students who did not complete two years of a single foreign language in high school must earn six credits of a college foreign language; such credits to be in addition to the 120 hours required for graduation.
