The Multimedia Journalism Major with Sports Media and Analytics Concentration requires 120 hours for graduation. The curriculum includes the following elements: Core Degree Requirements, Major Requirements, Concentration Requirements, Curriculum for Liberal Education, and Electives.

MAJOR REQUIREMENTS (I-II)

Multimedia Journalism Majors in the Sports Media and Analytics Concentration take 21 hours in Core Degree Requirements, 27 hours in courses specific to the major, and 15 hours in the concentration. See reverse for other requirements and "progress to degree" criteria. Only Communication (COMM) courses can meet degree and major requirements.

IV. ELECTIVES

In addition to Major, Concentration, and CLE requirements, students must complete elective hours to reach 120 hours for graduation. Those hours must be earned outside the Department of Communication and might be taken in a minor, cognate or double major. Students might consider education abroad, an internship, a field study, undergraduate research, independent study, or other non-required CLE or foreign language courses.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

1. The Multimedia Journalism Major with Sports Media and Analytics Concentration requires 120 hours for graduation. The curriculum includes the following elements: Core Degree Requirements (21 hours), Major Requirements (27 hours), Concentration Requirements (15 hours), Curriculum for Liberal Education (36 hours), and Electives (21 hours).

Total hours for graduation: 120

- 2. Minimum of 63 hours in COMM; COMM courses beyond 63 hours will not count toward graduation.
- 3. Overall GPA of 2.0; COMM GPA 2.0, based on all COMM courses the student has completed.
- 4. Courses taken in major to fulfill graduation requirements must be graded A-F (not pass/fail).
- 5. COMM courses taken for a minor may NOT be counted toward major requirements.
- 6. Foreign Language—Requirement can be met in one of three ways:
 - 3 years of single foreign language in high school OR
 - 2 years of a single language in high school plus 1106 or equivalent in college OR
 - 1105-1106 or equivalent in college (This credit must be in addition to the 120 credits for graduation.)

PROGRESS TOWARD DEGREE

A student will be certified as making satisfactory progress toward a degree by meeting these requirements:

- Completion of COMM 1014 within the first 6 classes (18 hours) in the major. Minimum grade of 70% (C-) required.
- Completion of COMM 2124 within the first 8 classes (24 hours) in the major.
- Overall GPA—Students who fall below 2.0 will follow university policies for probation and subsequent suspension if the GPA is not raised during the probation period.
- COMM GPA—Students who fall below 2.0 in COMM will have one semester to regain the required GPA standards. All COMM courses are included in this calculation. A student who fails to make satisfactory progress toward degree after that semester will be blocked from continuing in MJ or another COMM major.

In accordance with SCHEV requirements, a course may not be used to satisfy both a common degree core and general education (i.e., CLE or Pathways) requirements.
