Hours Requirement: A total of 120 hours is required to graduate with a Political Science degree.

In major GPA: All of the courses used in Sections I, II, and III are included in the in-major GPA. The overall and in-major GPAs required for graduation are 2.0.

Satisfactory Progress: To proceed satisfactorily toward a degree, a student must complete PSCI 1014, 1024, and 2024 by the end of the semester in which 60 hours have been attempted; must maintain an overall GPA of at least 2.0 and must maintain an in major GPA of 2.0.

**<u>Free Electives</u>**: Hours not required by the Curriculum for Liberal Education or the major are "free electives" and may be taken anywhere in the university.

<u>Prerequisites</u>: Some courses required for this major have pre-/co-requisite and/or enrollment requirements. Please refer to Undergraduate Course Catalog or consult your advisor for information about pre-/co-requisite and enrollment requirements. These courses are noted with an asterisk (\*).
