<u>GPA Requirements</u>: Students must maintain a 2.0 GPA in the Classical Studies major. The in-major GPA is calculated as the GPA in all courses a student takes for the Classical Studies major. A minimum grade of C (2.0) must be earned by Classical Studies majors in all courses taken to satisfy the Classical Studies major. No course taken Pass/Fail can be included in a Classical Studies Major.

<u>Total Hours Required</u>: Students must complete a minimum of 120 hours in order to graduate.

#### Satisfactory Progress Toward Degree, in addition to university policies regarding satisfactory progress:

- 1. Completion of the Curriculum for Liberal Education or Pathways appropriate for the term and year of entrance.
- 2. Completion of 15 hours of the major upon having completed 72 hours.

<u>High School Language Requirement:</u> Students who did not successfully complete at least two years of a single foreign, classical, or sign language during high school must successfully complete six semester hours of a single foreign, classical, or sign language at the college level. Courses taken to meet this requirement do not count toward the hours required for graduation. Please consult the Undergraduate Catalog for details.

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
