Satisfactory progress toward the degree is defined as successful completion of the Pathways requirements for Pathways 1F, 4, MATH 1014, and HD 1004 by the time the student has attempted 72 semester hours.

In addition to satisfying all University, Pathways, and Human Development major requirements, students will complete sufficient Free Electives to total 120 credit hours.
