- University min. GPA is 2.0. In-major min. GPA is 2.0. All core courses and major courses count toward the in-major GPA.
- As per University guidelines, degree core courses cannot double count to satisfy other requirements. If a Major Elective is a Pathways course, it can fulfill both a Pathways and Major requirement, but the credit hours will only be counted once.
- Some courses listed on this checksheet may have prerequisites; see Undergraduate Catalog.
- Satisfactory progress toward the degree is defined as successful completion of HD 1004 and Pathways Concepts 1F, 4, and 5F by the time the student has attempted 72 semester hours.

<sup>1</sup>Class sequences in BIOL cannot be mixed and matched. For instance, students cannot take BIOL 1105 and BIOL 1014. Students pursuing some careers may need to take BIOL 1105 and 1106 specifically, and may also need to take associated labs. Consult with an academic advisor as needed.

<sup>2</sup>Cons 2304 is recommended because it can double count for Pathways 5F and for a Disciplinary Breadth elective (see next page of checksheet); HD 3024 is recommended because it can double count for Pathways 5A and for a Human Development elective (see next page of checksheet).

<sup>3</sup>Students in the Minor in Disability Studies (DST) may fulfill Pathways 2 and 6D with a course from the DST minor.

<sup>4</sup>SOC 1004 double counts for Concepts 3 and 7, so students will only need to take 42 credit hours to fulfill their required Pathways courses, not 45.
