- (3) All courses to fulfill "Philosophy Major Requirements" must be taken at the A/F and be completed with a minimum GPA of 2.0. Students must also maintain an overall GPA of 2.0.
- (4) Eligibility for continued enrollment: Checksheet requirements adhere to the "Satisfactory Progress" toward degree policy of the university (Policy 91)
