General PPE Major Requirements and Guidelines

- (1) #These courses have prerequisites or co-requisites that must be satisfied. Please consult the Undergraduate Course Catalog for the latest statement of these requirements.
- (2) *The PPE Gateway Course (PHIL/PSCI/ECON 2894 or PPE 2894) fulfills 3 credit hours (Concepts 2 or 3) and the PPE Capstone Course (PHIL/PSCI/ECON 4884 or PPE 4884) fulfills 3 credit hours (Concepts 1(A) or 2) under the "Pathways General Education Requirements."
- (3) In accordance with University Guidelines, courses satisfying degree core requirements may not be double counted to satisfy other areas of degree (e.g. Pathways).
- (4) **Students must take at least five courses at the 3000-4000 level from the selection of "PPE Major Courses."
- (5) ***As part of their free elective courses, students are encouraged to take an internship course or participate in another experiential learning opportunity, for example, in the context of PPE 4964.
- (6) No more than 50% of the graded course credits required for the PPE Major may be double-counted by a student also enrolled in a Philosophy, Political Science, or Economics major.
- (7) All courses to fulfill the "PPE Major Requirements" must be taken A/F and be completed with a minimum GPA of 2.0. Students must also maintain an overall GPA of 2.0.
- (8) Foreign language requirement: Students who did not successfully complete at least two years of a single foreign, classical, or sign language during high school must successfully complete six semester hours of a single foreign, classical, or sign language at the college level. Courses taken to meet this requirement do not count toward the hours required for graduation. Please consult the Undergraduate Catalog for details.
- (9) Eligibility for continued enrollment: Checksheet requirements adhere to the "Satisfactory Progress" toward degree policy of the university (Policy 91).
- (10)A minimum of 120 semester credit hours is required for graduation.
